

Notes:

1. Individual, privately owned finger piers not shown.
2. Slip ID numbers are associated with deeds.
3. Slips 1-11 are 16' wide, 12-15 are 12' wide, slips 11 and 12 are combined into one slip and slip 10 does not exist.
4. Piling Information. Pilings were measured from their top to the bottom of the riverbed. Length will need to be added to factor in how far into the riverbed they need to be driven (e.g., 16').
 The majority of our piling are approximately 9" in diameter. Some are as large as 12" and some as small as 8" in diameter.
 50 piling are 21' (plus depth into riverbed). These piling are in the water.
 47 piling are 18' (plus depth into riverbed). These piling are in the water.
 12 piling are 21' (plus depth into riverbed). These piling are in the water.
 40 piling are 4' (plus depth into land). These piling are on the shore (hard ground) and support the elevated walkway. I doubt they need to be driven as far into the ground as the ones over water.
